

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship: Spring 2004 Cycle Now Open

Sponsored by: US Department of State, Bureau of Educational & Cultural Affairs

Administered by: Institute of International Education (IIE).

This program offers a competition for awards for study abroad, for US citizen students who are receiving federal Pell Grant funding at a 2-year or 4-year college or university.

Selected by competition, recipients are awarded up to \$5000 to defray the costs associated with studying abroad.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a Gilman International Scholarship, an applicant must meet all of the following criteria:

1. The applicant is a citizen of the United States. (Permanent Residents of the United States are not eligible.)
2. The applicant is an undergraduate student in good standing at an institution of higher education in the United States (including both two-year and four-year institutions).
3. The applicant is receiving federal Pell Grant funding during the academic term of his/her application.
4. The applicant is applying to or been accepted for a program of study abroad eligible for credit by the student's home institution. (Proof of program acceptance is required for final award disbursement.)
5. The applicant will not study in a country which is currently under a Travel Warning issued by the United States Department of State or Cuba. To find a list of these countries, please see http://travel.state.gov/warnings_list.html.
6. The applicant is applying to a country-based study abroad program. Multi-country tours and programs are not eligible.
7. The applicant has a complete application (including both financial aid and study abroad advisor portions) and has ensured that their current official transcript has been received by the Institute of International Education.
